Directions
Traveling east on the Mountain Parkway, take exit 33 at Slade. Turn left and then left again onto KY 11/15. After 1.4-mile, turn right on KY 77. Follow 77 through Nada Tunnel and across the Red River, turning left onto a gravel road (Forest Service Road 23) after crossing the river. Follow this road, which will turn back to pavement, for 3 miles before turning right onto the gravel Indian Creek Road (Forest Service Road 9). Follow this road to roadside pull-offs.



Parking
Limited roadside parking



Open Dates
Trail is open all year.



Permit
You must buy a permit if **camping** in the Red River Gorge between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.



Accessibility
These trails do not meet accessibility standards for persons with disabilities.

This hiking-only trail is closed to motorized vehicles.



Consumption of alcohol and open containers of alcohol are prohibited.



Camping and firebuilding in rock shelters is prohibited.



No climbing or rappelling within 300 feet of Sky Bridge, Grays Arch, Nada Tunnel, or Chimney Top Rock overlooks.

Rock climbers come from around the world to climb the cliffs of the Red River Gorge. The overhanging rock faces offer the ultimate climbing challenge. Before climbing, make sure you are properly equipped with the right gear and know-how.

Forest Service authorization is required prior to the development of any new climbing routes involving the permanent installation of new fixed anchors, new trail construction, or clearing of vegetation.

Pebble Beach Trail #237 is located on the Cumberland Ranger District in the Red River Gorge. This short, steep trail that provides access to the Pebble Beach climbing area.

Rules and Regulations

Observe these rules to help protect the forest resources, facilities and visitor experience.

The following are prohibited:

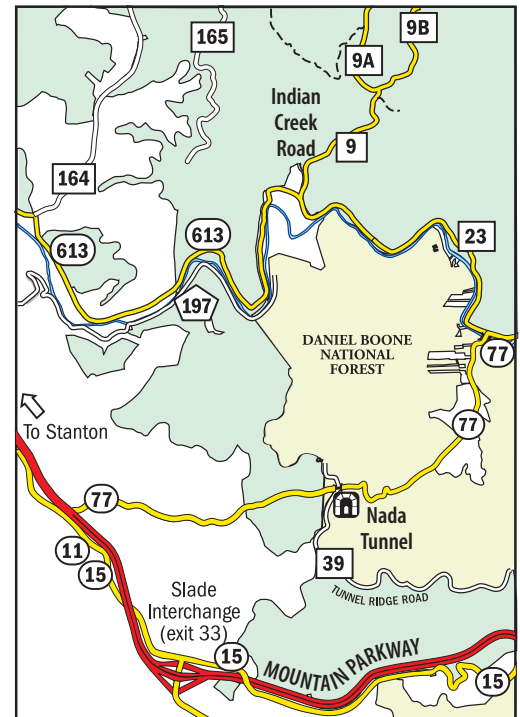
- Development of any new rock climbing, bouldering or rappelling areas and development of any climbing routes involving the permanent installation of new fixed anchors or new trail construction without prior Forest Service authorization.
- No new climbing routes using fixed anchors are allowed within the Clifty Wilderness. However, maintenance or replacement of existing approved fixed anchors is allowed by non-mechanized means.
- Climbing or rappelling within 300 feet of Sky Bridge, Grays Arch, Nada Tunnel, or Chimney Top Rock overlooks.
- Building, maintaining, attending and using a fire, campfire or stove within 100 feet of the base of any cliff or the back of a rock shelter.
- Camping within 300 feet of any developed road, or Tunnel Ridge Road and its associated parking lots.
- Camping within 300 feet of any developed trail.
- Camping within 600 feet of Grays Arch in the Red River Gorge Geological Area.

Permit Information

A permit is required for overnight camping in the Red River Gorge Geological Area and Indian Creek. All vehicles on KY 15 or in the Red River Gorge and Indian Creek areas north of KY 15 must display a permit between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. Permits are available at local stores and the Gladie Visitor Center.

Vehicles and Parking

- Keep vehicles on established roads. All vehicle traffic is restricted to roads only.
- Parking on Tunnel Ridge Road is limited to designated parking sites.
- Off-highway vehicle use is prohibited in the Red River Gorge Geological Area.

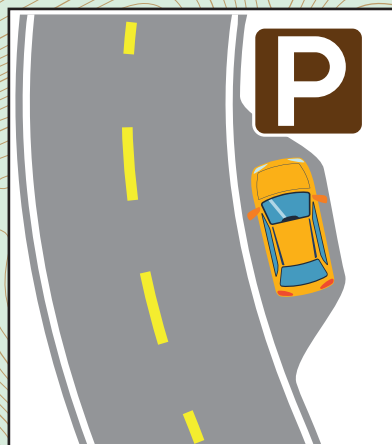
